

What if you gave birth to the devil? When a queer pregnant woman accepts a dinner invitation from her child's father, the evening spirals into a demonic fever dream of love, fear, and transformation. A modern queer twist on Rosemary's Baby, Son of Sara: Volume 1 turns maternal anxiety into something darkly funny, tender, and terrifying—a descent into the madness of creation where every contraction feels like a cosmic joke.

Toronto filmmaker Houston Bone (Teenagers, I Don't Know Who You Are) delivers a fearless debut feature that balances grotesque imagery with aching vulnerability. With an eye for both horror and heart, Bone blends practical effects, handheld camerawork, and a wicked sense of humour to explore the chaos of queer identity, bodily autonomy, and the violent beauty of bringing something new into the world.

Drawing inspiration from genre icons like James Whale and Clive Barker, Bone channels their spirit of transgression and spectacle into a film that feels startlingly personal. The result is both intimate and unhinged—a cinematic birth scream wrapped in latex, blood, and affection.

At once profane and poetic, Son of Sara: Volume 1 continues Canada's legacy of bold, boundary-pushing genre cinema. It's a love story, a monster movie, and a confession all in one—proof that even the devil deserves a little tenderness.

BITS alum Ava Maria Safai (ZIP) returns to the festival with Foreigner, her sharp, confident, and stylish feature debut, first developed through the 2023 Blood in the Snow Horror Development Lab.

Set in 2004, the film follows Yasamin (Rose Dehghan), an Iranian teenager newly arrived in Canada who faces her ultimate nightmare: fitting in at high school. When the popular clique led by Rachel (Chloë MacLeod), dressed in pink and wearing cult-like smiles like jewelry, takes a sudden interest in her, Yasamin dives headfirst into their world. Desperate to belong, she begins to change everything from her voice to her name, slowly losing her sense of self. But when she dyes her hair blonde with a bottle of DIE BLONDE, something far darker awakens. What begins as a makeover turns into a chilling transformation with a splash of demonic possession.

Foreigner is pure bubblegum pop horror, a mix of Heathers, Carrie, Get Out, and The Exorcist, wrapped in a Mean Girls bow. Satirical, cutthroat, and twisted, it blends early-2000s coming-of-age nostalgia with bone-chilling dark comedy. The film uses horror to explore the immigrant teen experience and its complex relationship with Canadian nationalism, weaving themes of grief, cultural assimilation, and selfhood.

With standout performances from Rose Dehghan and Chloë MacLeod, and glossy, evocative cinematography by Saarthak Taneja, Foreigner cements itself as a debut bound for cult status: inventive, vulnerable, and unforgettable..


## **BUFFET INFINITY**

Do you remember the iconic Canadian show SCTV? What about those times of late-night channel surfing and seeing some bizarre yet funny ads? Buffet Infinity will feel like a throwback to that time when you felt hungry for food and entertainment.

Shot entirely in Edmonton, Buffet Infinity is the result of Glassman's clever combination of hundreds of hours of original, low-budget TV ads created to narrate an all-out feud between two restaurant owners in the fictional town of Westridge County.



Although the initial feel is that of chaos, the film takes its time unfolding this story. As you, the viewer, channel surf, the TV ads appear quite mundane at first. Over time, you get to know the various local business owners through their charming yet bizarre marketing campaigns. When the chain restaurant Buffet Infinity moves into town, a feud with local favourite Jenny's Sandwich Shop develops and intensifies through their TV ads.

At the same time, some sinister events start to take place, including the appearance of a sinkhole. Coincidence? You will have to be the judge.

What at first appears comical becomes darker, and you cannot simply look away. A true labour of love, Glassman's creativity will keep your eyes glued to the screen. This film will make you laugh and question reality while at the same time offering some real "food for thought."

If you have an affinity for absurdist, satirical, smart humour, Buffet Infinity will expand your mind.

## **FRESH MEAT**

Clout is a hell of a drug—and this feed has side effects. A crew of internet influencers breaks into an abandoned Ontario penitentiary, chasing haunted-prison footage and viral bragging rights. What begins as a content stunt for clicks and followers quickly descends into a waking nightmare when they discover a feral inmate still prowling the decaying cell blocks. As their livestream keeps rolling, the group's desperate scramble for engagement turns into a fight for survival.

Writer-director Daniel Turres (Here for Blood) unleashes a savage and darkly funny blend of old-school survival horror and razor-sharp social satire. Shot on location in an actual decommissioned prison, Fresh Meat makes the most of its eerie atmosphere: peeling walls, flickering ring lights, and the ever-present hum of cameras capturing every scream. The film dives deep into the psychology of digital fame—where fear, ego, and desperation feed off one another in a relentless cycle of performance and punishment.

With strong ensemble performances from Joelle Farrow, Mika Amonsen, Hannah Galway, Jorja Cadence, and Karn Kalra, Fresh Meat delivers a grisly, practical-effects-driven spectacle that feels both timely and timeless. Turres doesn't just critique influencer culture; he weaponizes it, crafting a blood-soaked mirror of our hunger for validation and spectacle.

Visceral, biting, and disturbingly relevant, Fresh Meat is a viciously entertaining reminder that in the attention economy, the feed never sleeps—and the algorithm always eats first.



## NASH THE SLASH RISES AGAIN!

From writer/director Tim Kowalski comes a captivating documentary exploring the life and legacy of one of Toronto's most enigmatic artists. With few comparable influences at the time, Nash the Slash was a true pioneer of experimental electronic music. Combining his love of horror with a mysterious, theatrical image and mesmerizing visual performances, he brought a groundbreaking sense of artistry to the stage that continues to inspire musicians today.

The film vividly captures the underground culture that thrived in 1970s Toronto, a community of creative misfits bonded by a shared passion for film. For Nash the Slash, it was his love of horror that shaped both his haunting image and his ethereal, industrial sound.

An artist ahead of his time, Nash faced barriers to mainstream acceptance but refused to compromise. He took full control of his work, producing, distributing, and performing every element himself.

Featuring interviews with Gary Numan, Danielle Dax, Toronto icon Corpusse, and many others, the film showcases how deeply Nash the Slash influenced generations of musicians and fans alike.

## THE HILARIOUS HOUSE OF FRIGHTENSTEIN

Just over 54 years ago, in the quiet studios of CHCH-TV in Hamilton, a children's show was created that has since become a cult phenomenon. The Hilarious House of Frightenstein blended horror, comedy, and science with unrestrained imagination, anchored by the manic brilliance of Billy Van, who played most of the show's characters, alongside Fishka Rais, Guy Big, Dr. Julius Sumner Miller, and the legendary Vincent Price. The result was 130 episodes of pure early-morning magic that continue to air around the world to this day.

Behind the Castle Doors: The Origin of The Hilarious House of Frightenstein chronicles the show's unlikely creation, its chaotic production schedule, and its enduring impact on generations of fans. It also highlights the remarkable work of associate producer and "Super Hippy" Mitch Markowitz, whose tireless efforts have helped revive the series, sparking a wave of new merchandise, a spin-off audio album (produced by BITS alum Anthony Mann), comic books, and a new animated children's series, Happy House of Frightenstein.

Co-directors Morgan Baker and Tammy Heisel bring a warm, heartfelt touch to the documentary, allowing the show's surviving writers and crew to tell their stories with candor and joy. Their passion shines through in every frame, crafting a vibrant celebration of creativity, nostalgia, and Canadian television history. The film also features the final interview with series creator "Riff" Markowitz, who passed away in September, making this tribute both timely and deeply moving.

Cassandra Naud returns as CW, the charismatic villain and master of identity theft with an uncanny talent for bending people to her will. This time, she's in southern France at a farmhouse-turned-vineyard hotel with her partner Dianne (Lisa Delmar), celebrating their one-year anniversary. Into this idyllic scene arrives Charlotte (Georgina Campbell), an influencer visiting the chateau to showcase it to her followers. Finding it below her standards, she's not shy about saying so. Charlotte quickly takes a liking to Dianne, drawing CW's dangerous glare.



Madison White (Emily Tennant) also returns as the title character and CW's former target from the original Influencer, having narrowly escaped CW's web of deceit spun a year earlier in Thailand. Jacob (Jonathan Whitesell) enters the picture as the ultimate purveyor of bro culture, lounging poolside in Bali, shirt off, headset on, firing off relationship tips to men online from an estate fit for royalty.

All of these forces converge in Bali, each with their own agenda, setting the stage for a psychological showdown worthy of this alpha trio. The locations are stunning, the cinematography sharp and precise, and the sound design relentlessly propels the tension forward. The film walks a knife's edge from its opening moments to its explosive finale, with technology once again playing a pivotal role whenever CW is near.
